Seasonal Cheat Sheet

Whether or not you live in a smaller space, like an apartment, it can be almost impossible to fit all four seasons of your wardrobe in one closet!

These seven steps offer a quick guide to help you tackle any seasonal wardrobe switch.

Note: This type of project may take you 6-15 hours to do on your own, So, if you're short on time, energy, or the will to do it alone, you can call the Swoon Spaces team to tackle it in half the time!

- Pull-out & sort your clothing items. Sort items into piles based on category. This gets overwhelming quickly, but this is the most time consuming part.
- 102 Edit each pile/category.
 Editing is the process where you decide which items to keep! Have two trash bags handy one for garbage & one for donations!





- Take inventory & separate by season. Go through each pile, decide if you use each item year-round or only during a specific season, then separate.
 - Utilize your 'Prime Real Estate'. Place clothing for the current season in 'prime real estate' spaces, easily accessible areas, within arms reach.





Seasonal Cheat Sheet



Oo a final sweep/edit of categories going into storage.
You won't be seeing these out-of-season pieces for 7+ months, so make sure you absolutely LOVE

season pieces for 7+ months, so make sure you absolutely LOVE THEM before storing them. If you have doubts about something, donate it (and don't look back)! 06

Store out-of-season categories.

Great storage spaces in your home can be at the top of your closets, under the bed, in the basement, garage, or in an extra storage closet.



SWOON TIP: Rent a storage unit

If needed, get an off-site storage unit.
Use clear plastic bins so you can easily see and access any items you may want to fish out in the middle of the season.

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Label every bin or storage container before placing them into storage for the season. After all, you didn't do all of this work for nothin' and want to make sure the systems you've built stay intact.
